<sup>\*</sup> Cross-State Toll Clarification: Although the Pa. Turnpike opened to traffic Oct. 1, 1940, at the time it ran just 160 miles from Irwin, PA to Middlesex, PA; therefore, the 1956 toll rate is used for comparison purposes as it represents the earliest, cross-state Turnpike toll.

<sup>+</sup> Eastbound cross-state motorists pay more than westbound motorists on the PA Turnpike due to a "one-way" toll at the Gateway Toll Plaza (#2) near the Ohio border implemented in 2006. Eastbound Class-1 (passenger) vehicles entering Pennsylvania at Gateway pay a flat fee of \$4.06 (E-ZPass rate) or \$5.25 (cash rate); but no toll is collected from westbound vehicles at Gateway. The one-way tolling conversion was required to reduce toll-plaza congestion and allow the construction of Express E-ZPass lanes at Gateway. NOTE: The Gateway flat fee will increase to \$4.14 (E-ZPass) and \$5.90 (cash) in 2014.
